# Dress Code

# On The Day

## Conditions of Entry

You're prohibited from bringing in the following:

Any item which may be interpreted as a potential weapon, including sharp or pointed objects (e.g. knives, large corkscrews), pyrotechnics and 'personal protection' sprays.

Bags larger than 16" x 12" x 12" (40cm x 30cm x 30cm).

Large flags (max. 2'x2'/60cm x 60cm) banners, rattles, klaxons, oversized hats or any items causing an obstruction or nuisance.

All promotional, commercial, political or religious items of whatever nature, including but not limited to banners, signs, symbols, marketing materials and leaflets (unless expressly authorised by the LTA).

Spectators are advised that the use of laptops, professional video equipment is not permitted on site. Photographic equipment with lenses of more than 300mm, when extended, is not permitted on site.

## Entry Times

Gates will open to the public at 10am every day.

## Re-entry

If you wish to leave and re-enter the grounds you will need to collect a wristband from a Security team member on exiting the grounds. In order to be re-admitted you will need to show both the wristband and a valid ticket. Please be aware you will be handed a wristband only when leaving the venue and not before.





# On The Day

## Courtside Etiquette

To ensure players and fans have the best possible experience at the Rothestay International Eastbourne, we have set the following guidelines for when you are in and around the courts:

- Please keep noise to a minimum during play.
- Please don't leave your seat unless Players are at the bench.
- Mobile phones must be switched off in the vicinity of the courts.
- Please be respectful of those around you by ensuring that you do not obstruct their view or cause any unnecessary inconvenience.
- Flash photography is strictly forbidden in the stands.
- Photographic equipment with lenses of more than 300mm, when extended, is not permitted on site.

## Left Luggage

Unfortunately there is no left luggage facility on site. You may not bring a bag larger than 16" x 12" x 12" (40cm x 30cm x 30cm) into the grounds. For your safety, all bags are subject to inspection by our security team and are brought to the tournament at the owner's risk.





# Getting to the Rothesay International Eastbourne

## Train

Eastbourne is well connected via the Southern Rail service. It's approximately 90 minutes from London Victoria Station – via London Gatwick Airport. A regional service operates from Brighton (approx. 40 mins), Ashford International (approx. 1 hour) and Ore (approx. 35 mins).

The train station doesn't offer step free access however staff are on hand between 6am – 10pm to assist. For more information on accessibility and mobility access, please visit the Eastbourne Station information page on the Southern Rail website.

The walk from Eastbourne station to Devonshire Park is approximately 0.7 miles and will take between 15 – 20 minutes. Alternatively there are taxis located outside of Eastbourne station.

## Bus

National Express services run direct from London Victoria Coach Station Brighton.

Brighton and Hove buses also operate Coaster buses between Eastbourne and Brighton, passing through scenic National Park.

Stagecoach operate buses in and around Eastbourne, including services to Hastings.

## Shuttle Bus

A shuttle bus service from Cuckmere Buses will operate during the tournament from Saturday 24 June through to Saturday 1 July.

## Car

The main approach roads are the A22 from London, A259 from Hastings, and A27 from Brighton.

Car parking is available at the NCP car park at Trinity Place. Saffrons Car Park (off Compton Place – BN21 1EA) will be a public car park with a £8 charge per car, per day and is available on a first come, first serve basis.

Blue Badge car parking spaces are free and available with easy access to Gate 7. Please note that blue badge parking is allocated on a first come, first served basis.

## Air

London Gatwick Airport is approximately a 55 minute train journey away with direct trains running between Gatwick and Eastbourne.
